Just a few years ago, Universal Preservation Hall, a historic Baptist church, was slated to be turned into a parking lot. But thanks to the efforts of a group of dedicated and visionary Saratogians, the church is now being remodeled into a 600+ seat performance hall and will be a centerpiece of art and culture in downtown Saratoga Springs. Although UPH is still being renovated, we are very excited to have it join the ranks as one of Flurry's great dance halls. Please stop in for a dance and show your support for the effort that is going into restoring this beautiful venue.

For those of you who are new to this year's Flurry, we hope you have the time of your life and welcome you to our family. For those of you who are returning Flurry folks, thank you for your continued support. We look forward to dancing, jamming and singing with you this year, and for many years to come!

UNIVERSAL PRESERVATION HALL — Dance Flurry 2009

It is with great delight that we include the Universal Preservation Hall in our 2009 Festival. A grand and historic structure, UPH offers a new dance and concert space within a short distance of the Festival headquarters. Once condemned in 1999 to be a parking lot, Saratoga Springs UPH was rescued by a group of dedicated and visionary Saratogians, who envisioned a true community space, adding to downtown's vitality and continuation of a culture of

the arts by which Saratoga is coming to be known.

SSUPH will transform this gem of a historic building -- creating a 600-700 seat auditorium that will generate commerce for downtown and surrounding businesses through street traffic, patronage of restaurants and shops as the theater goers head to concerts of all types, wedding receptions, lectures, readings, theater productions, film festivals and film series, corporate meetings, art gallery events, dances, etc. It is a true community project.

Still in use today by the Universal Baptist Church, the Universal Preservation Hall was built in 1871 by the Methodist-Episcopal church to replace a smaller church building that was built in 1841. It was sold to the Universal Baptist Church in 1976 who subsequently transferred the title to UPH.

The current building was designed by Elbridge Boyden of Worcester, Massachusetts (who has several structures on the National Register). Architectural historians recognize it as is one of the earliest and finest examples of High Victorian Gothic architecture in the country. The imposing building features twenty-two inch thick masonry walls, Saratoga's tallest spire, a 3000 pound Meneely bell (cast in Troy) in its main tower, and sixteen Gothic stained glass windows (all non-religious) to flood the Great Hall with light.

William Jennings Bryan, Teddy Roosevelt, Henry Ward Beecher, Frederick Douglass, and William Howard Taft, among others, have attended services, preached, or lectured at UPH.

Work to completely restore UPH continues, and donations for new floors and other projects are greatly needed and appreciated. As you enjoy the music and dance offered at UPH this weekend, please consider making a donation to help support this true gem of Saratoga Springs!

NEW VENUE — Caffè Lena



Caffè Lena is widely recognized as the oldest continuously operating folk club in the United States. Opened in 1960, the café has helped to launch many of America's best -loved songwriters, including Bob Dylan, Arlo Guthrie, Ani DiFranco, Emmylou Harris, Nanci Griffith, and many more.

Caffè Lena has always been a place where people renew their faith in the power of music. They come up the stairs and enter a small room where a world-class performer is only feet away from the audience; where they can see every movement of fingers on frets and feel a foot tapping rhythm on the stage. It's a place to get away from the hustle and bustle of the world and hear the true voice of America—the mix of Africa and Europe, the story of rural life, the instruments our ancestors danced and sang to. It's a place to slow down, look back, look more deeply at now, see the connections between past and present, and feel like you're standing on terra firma.

The room itself, having been the scene of countless performances for forty-eight years, has absorbed the memories of great shows and colorful characters, love of Lena, friends met and stories told. Down through the years it has been invested with so much love and dedication that it has somehow become capable of returning the love.



Today the Caffè Lena mission is carried forward by a deeply dedicated and large community of musicians, volunteers, a board of directors, and a small paid staff, all of whom labor year in and year out to create a welcoming gathering place for the community and give non-commercial music a chance to flourish. Since Lena's passing in 1989, the booking and management of the club has continued to reflect Lena's core principals of generosity, dedication to kindness above profit, respect for our inherited folk culture. and support for new spins on old traditions. The Caffè Lena stage is still hailed as one of the warmest and most welcoming to artists who are creating quality art outside the confines of the commercial music industry. In 2008, Caffè Lena was honored as a recipient of the "Best Small Venue" award from the International Folk Alliance.

Caffè Lena is one of the oldest members of Saratoga Spring's vibrant downtown business community and draws year 'round visitors from all of upstate New York, Quebec, New Jersey, Massachusetts and Vermont. The Caffè hosts 375 events each year, serving about 12,000 customers in a simple 85seat room, and will soon have a major renovation that will enhance access for disabled people and bring greater comfort to all. There is music of many varieties, children's programming, poetry, storytelling, comedy, an active theater program, occasional workshops and classes, and rentals for private events and music lessons.

Ten Tips for Beginning Dancers (CDSS News #109 Nov/Dec 1992)

- 1. Relax. Everyone was a beginner at one time
- 2. Don't panic. If you mess up, smile, apologize and go on to the next figure. It's more important to be in the right place for the next figure than to complete every move.
- 3. Learn the basic figures and timing before adding flourishes. You'll have lots of time later to add your own touches.
- 4. It's the custom to change partners for each dance, and women ask men to dance as often as men ask women. (And women ask women, and men ask men.)
- 5. If you ask someone to dance and he or she says no, don't worry about it.
- 6. Don't rush away from your partner at the end of a dance. Take time to thanks them, and calmly find another. (Warning: this is hard to do in some dance communities.)
- Don't look at the floor. Eye contact is an important part of contra and English country dancing.
- 8. Ask experienced dancers to dance with you; they'll help point you in the right direction if you get confused.
- Sweating is natural and healthy, and there's a lot of it at dances. Dress coolly, bring a towel (or extra shirt) if you wish, and take breaks in the cool air outside.
- 10. After you have some dance experience and know what you're doing, beginners will need your help. Remember the first rule: relax.

Festival History

It was pure luck that the Dance Flurry Festival came into being.

In 1987, Nancy Gretta and Paul Rosenberg were car-pooling to the Brattleboro, Vermont, Labor Day Dawn Dance, reminiscing about how wonderful the one and only Old Songs Winter Dance Fest had been. In 1986, the 2nd annual Winter Dance Fest had been in the planning stages when the director stepped down, and the upcoming 1988 festival had also just been cancelled. Nancy asked Paul (partially in jest) if he would organize a replacement festival.

The wheels began to spin, and Paul thought a smaller, one-day winter dance festival could be a logical extension of the Schenectady contra dance series, which he had developed earlier in 1987. This series was unique, being dedicated to the showcasing and development of callers and musicians from within the Capital District area of NY.

The Hudson-Mohawk Country Dancers was formed as a not-for-profit chapter of the Country Dance and Song Society (CDSS) around 1987, enabling them to obtain grants, and federal and state tax-exempt status (later know as Hudson-Mohawk Traditional Dances, Inc., and now as the DanceFlurry Organization).

The first February Dance Flurry was a one-day festival held at the Westmere Elementary School in Guilderland, NY, on February 13, 1988. Over 300 dancers attended a highly successful event, staffed entirely by 38 local and regional performers, including Jay Ungar, Molly Mason, George Wilson, Selma Kaplan, Pat Rust, Mary Cay Brass, Van Kaynor and the St. Regis String Band. The festival moved in 1989 to Farnsworth Middle School, in Guilderland, NY. In 1994, two weeks before the festival, broken water pipes flooded the gym floor and sent festival organizers scrambling to find a new location. The city of Saratoga



welcomed them, and has been the home of the Dance Flurry festival ever since. A festival which is one of the largest and most varied music and dance festivals on the east coast.

In 2006, Festival organizers were once again tested by the weather – this time by 100-mile-per-hour winds that knocked out power in the region from Friday to Sunday afternoon. Within hours, the organizers managed to put together a shortened version of the program, using portable generators for light and power. Many dancers and musicians who traveled long distances to attend the Flurry were grateful for the chance to have a "mini Flurry" during the day Saturday.

Now in its 22nd year, the Dance Flurry Festival is still going strong. With the support of its volunteers, the dance community, its host city, and especially those who enter its doors year after year, the Festival will continue to offer the sights, sounds and traditions of music and dance that have been handed down for generations.
